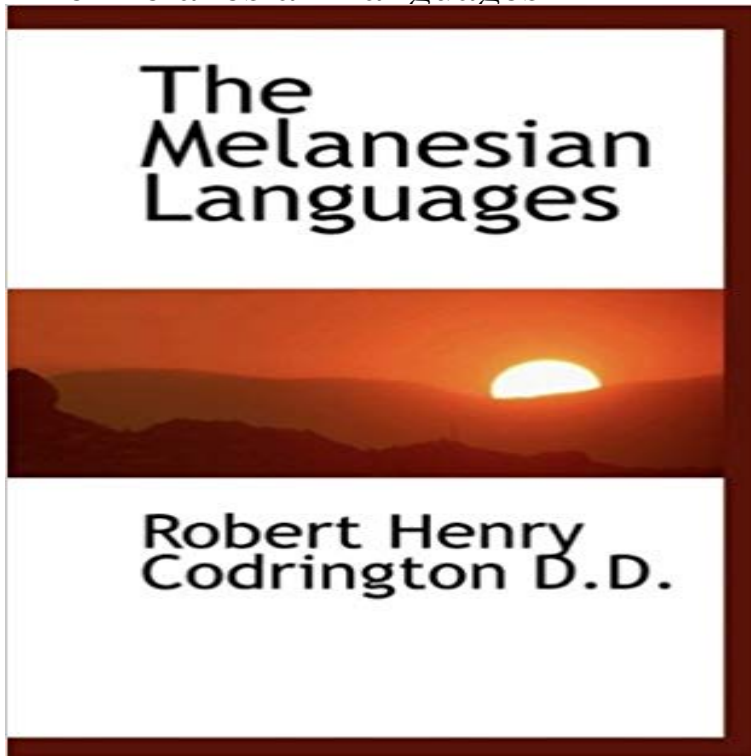


The Melanesian Languages
